

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE HAMLET OF FRENCHMAN BUTTE, SASKATCHEWAN.

The council of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No.501 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:-

1. In this Bylaw the expression:
 - (a) "curb" shall mean the lateral boundaries of a highway whether or not marked by curbing;
 - (b) "hamlet" means within the boundaries of the Hamlet of Frenchman Butte, as designated pursuant to section 20 of the Rural Municipality Act 1972;
 - (c) "highway" means any public highway within the Hamlet, and "public highway" means a public highway as defined by the Vehicles Act;
 - (d) "motor vehicle" means a motor vehicles as defined by the or pursuant to the Vehicles Act;
 - (e) "parking" shall mean the standing of a motor vehicle, whether occupied or not, upon a highway, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading, or in obedience to traffic regulations traffic signs or signals, or the direction of a traffic officer or constable.
2. No person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle under his control to be parked on any highway, except as may be authorized by this bylaw.
3. No person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle under his control to stand unattended on any highway, unless such motor vehicle shall first have been parked in the manner as in this bylaw provided.
4. Subject to the provisions of sections 5,6,7,8 and 9 hereof the parking of motor vehicles is hereby permitted on all highways.
5. No motor vehicle shall be parked on any highway except in the following manner, to wit: such motor vehicle shall be drawn up to the curb on the right hand side of the highway, at an angle of approximately forty-five degrees with the curb line and with the right front wheel at a distance of not more than 12 inches from the curb.
6. No motor vehicle shall be parked on any highway with the engine running, unless the same is under the control of a licensed operator.
7. No motor vehicle used or intended for the conveyance of inflammable, combustible, explosive or other dangerous materials, whether loaded or unloaded, shall be parked at any time upon a highway except for the sole purpose of, and only for the time necessary to receive or deliver orders.
8. The council may from time to time by resolution prohibit the parking of motor vehicles on any highway, or portion thereof. Every area where parking is prohibited shall be designated by the erection and maintenance therein of suitable signs or markers, clearly visible from the travelled portion of the highway, showing that parking in area is prohibited.
9. No person shall park a motor vehicle at any time within any area where parking has been prohibited in accordance with section 8.

10. No person shall deface, injure, destroy or remove any sign or marker erected in accordance with the provisions of section 9 hereof.

11. A person who contravenes any provisions of this bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of this Municipality.
