3.0 POLICY:

3.1 <u>MUNICIPAL ROAD CLASSIFICATIONS</u>

1. HEAVY HAUL/HIGH VOLUME ROAD (HH/HV)

Heavy Haul and High Volume Roads serve medium size Communities and Service Centers. These roads have a significant amount of commercial traffic because they provide inter- community links. The roads will normally be major arterial connector or collector roads linking with designated highways. These roads generally carry an average daily traffic (ADT) of 300 vehicles per day or higher.

2. PRIMARY GRID ROAD (PG)

Primary Grid Roads serve as an inter-municipal road network, which link small Communities with the higher-class roads. These roads can serve as the major haul routes or access for large industries and resources, which include: forestry, oil, grain and agricultural products, gravel, etc. This class can have a large amount of intermunicipal heavy truck traffic depending on the industry served. Average daily traffic (ADT) counts should exceed 10 heavy trucks or 100 vehicles.

3. GRID ROAD (G)

A grid road will be defined as a roadway which experiences light to moderate traffic loads. Grid roads may provide access to properties for residential, commercial or agricultural purposes.

4. INTERNAL COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL SUBDIVISION ROAD (ICS/IIS)

A Commercial / Industrial Road shall be defined as a roadway that is within a multi-lot commercial or industrial subdivision or exists only to provide access to the multi-lot subdivision.

5. <u>INTERNAL RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION ROAD (IRS)</u>

A Residential Road shall be defined as a roadway that is within a multi-lot residential subdivision or exists only to provide access to a multi-lot residential subdivision.

6. MAIN FARM ACCESS ROAD (MFA)

A Farmland Access Road shall be defined as a road which experiences occasional seasonal traffic to access agricultural property. Such roads will not be considered as adequate access for residential development permit purposes. These roads have a minimum right-of-way of 30 meters

7. ALTERNATIVE MAIN FARM ACCESS ROAD (AMFA)

A Farmland Access Road shall be defined as a road which experiences occasional seasonal traffic to access agricultural property. Such roads will not be considered as adequate access for residential development permit purposes. These roads have a right-of-way width of 20 meters.

4.0 RESPONSIBILITY/INTERPRETATION/REPEALING:

This policy shall be administered and interpreted by the Administrator; however, this policy cannot be amended without Council approval.

This policy replaces all previous policies and resolutions that have been passed by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501 with respect to the application of any and all parts of this policy and the terms and conditions contained herein.

1.0 PURPOSE:

1.1 The Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501 developed a *Dust Control Policy* to provide staff with direction under what circumstances an occupant of a residence qualifies for the application of a dust control product on roads adjacent to their residence within the RM.

2.0 **DEFINITIONS:**

- **2.1 CAO** means Chief Administrative Officer of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.2 Council means Council of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.3 Occupant means a person residing in a home within the Municipality, regardless of ownership.
- 2.4 RM means the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.5 Road means the travelling surface of a public road designed or intended for use by vehicles, but does not include a designated trail within the meaning of The Snowmobile Act or any other trail or path.

3.0 SCOPE:

3.1 This policy shall be applied whenever an occupant provides a written request, using Appendix A, the *Dust Control Application Form*, for the application of dust control on Municipal roads within the Municipality.

4.0 POLICY:

- 4.1 It is the policy of the Municipality to accept applications to provide dust control of 150 metres at a cost of 30% of the total of the application cost, under the following conditions, to occupants of the Municipality who reside in a home located adjacent to a Municipal road:
 - 4.1.1 Where the residence is located within 150 metres of the centre of the road; and
 - **4.1.2** Where the volume of traffic is greater than 30 vehicles per day, as determined by Municipal traffic counts.
 - **4.1.3** Where the above two conditions are not met, dust control may be applied at the ratepayers cost.

- 4.1.4 Subject to current year Operating Budget.
- 4.2 The ratepayer shall stake out the desired distance. If the ratepayer requires more than 150 metres, the additional will be at their cost.
- 4.3 The type of dust control product (sales oil, magnesium chloride, or calcium chloride) to be used at each specific location shall be determined by the Public Works Department of the Municipality.
- 4.4 Any subsequent re-application of a dust control product in the same calendar year shall be at the full cost to the ratepayer.
- 4.5 The Municipality will delay grading areas treated with magnesium chloride or calcium chloride type products in order to ensure the dust control product remains intact, but grading may be required in some areas if road conditions deteriorate.
- 4.6 Contrary to Section *Purchasing of Goods, Services, and Contracts Policy 100-06*, the Public Works Department is hereby authorized to purchase dust control products valued as established in the **current year operating budget**, to apply to approved locations.

5.0 RESPONSIBILITY/INTERPRETATION/REPEALING:

All Appendices attached to this policy may be amended from time to time based on operational need.

This policy shall be administered and interpreted by the CAO; however, this policy cannot be amended without Council approval.

This policy replaces all previous policies and resolutions that have been passed by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501 with respect to the application of any and all parts of this policy and the terms and conditions contained herein.
