BYLAW NO. 2021-15

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH A FEE TO APPEAL ASSESSMENTS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw may be referred to as the "Assessment Appeal Fee Bylaw".
- 2. In this bylaw:
 - a) "Act" shall mean "The Municipalities Act";
 - b) "Board" shall mean the
 - i) Board of Revision established by the Municipality; or
 - ii) District Board of Revision which has been created by the Municipality in partnership with other municipalities;
 - c) "Municipality" shall mean the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501;
 - d) "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary to the (District) Board of Revision.
- 3. A person desiring to appeal their assessment to the Board shall file their appeal in the form prescribed in the Act on or before the last date on which appeals can be lodged as indicated:
 - a) within the notice required by Section 217 of the Act; or
 - b) on the notice of assessment required by Sections 215 and 219 of the Act.
- 4. The following classes of properties and fees are established for the purpose of filing an appeal to the Board:

Residential	\$75.00

Agricultural – Non-arable	\$75.00

\$1,000,000	\$600.00
Where the Fair Value Assessment is \$1,000,000 or more	\$800.00

- 5. The applicable fee shall be payable to the Municipality and may be paid at the time of filing the appeal and in any event no later than the final date for lodging an appeal with the Board.
- 6. Where an appellant fails to pay the applicable fee pursuant to Sections 4 and 5 of this bylaw, the appeal is deemed to be dismissed.
- 7. The Municipality shall refund any fee that was submitted by the appellant if:
 - a) the appeal is successful either in whole or in part by decision of either the Board or the Assessment Appeal Committee of the Saskatchewan Municipal Board;
 - b) the appeal is not filed by the Secretary of the Board;
 - c) the appeal is withdrawn in accordance with Section 227 of the Act; or
 - d) an agreement is entered into pursuant to Section 228 of the Act.
- 8. A fee of \$75.00 per appeal is hereby established for any person who desires to be involved as a party in a hearing before the Board.
- 9. A fee of \$75.00 per appeal is hereby established for any person who wishes to obtain copies of the Board's decision and other documents.

1. PURPOSE:

To ensure that Rate-Payers are being charged a fair price for new and used culverts, as such that the sale of the culverts to Rate-Payers will not be abused by Rate-Payers. New culverts are required in the municipal right of way to ensure that the municipality will not have to replace the culverts shortly after installation.

2. **DEFINITIONS:**

- **2.1 CAO:** Means the Chief Administrative Officer of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501
- 2.2 Council: Means Council for the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.3 Rate-Payer: tax payer or resident of the R.M.
- 2.4 R.M.: shall mean the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501

3.0 SCOPE:

- 3.1 Charges for new culverts
- 3.2 Charges for used culverts

4.0 POLICY:

- 4.1 New and used culverts may be sold to Rate-Payers at the discretion of the Infrastructure Manager or Public Works Foreman.
- 4.2 Culverts sold must be for use within the R.M., the Village of Paradise Hill or the Town of St. Walburg.
- 4.3 New culverts shall be sold at cost plus 10% for administration
- 4.4 Used culverts shall be sold at 30% of current purchase price.

5.0 SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS (if applicable)

5.1 The RM reserves the right to refuse the sale of culverts if there is not adequate inventory on hand to meet the needs of the R.M.

6.0 EXCEPTIONS – (if applicable)

6.1 Oversized culverts (900 mm and larger) maybe sold at the discretion of the Public Works Foreman for a value not less than scrap metal price.

1. PURPOSE:

To establish a policy by which fees will be charged for the snow ploughing of private drives and lanes

2. **DEFINITIONS:**

- **2.1 CAO:** Means the Chief Administrative Officer of the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.2 Council: Means Council for the Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501.
- 2.3 Landowner: Means the registered owner.
- **2.4** Ploughing of Private Drives and Lanes: Shall mean one pass going into property and one pass exiting property. It does not include additional clearing of yard etc.
- **2.5** Private Drives and Lanes: Means a driveway or access lane that is located on property owned by a ratepayer and is not within or on a road allowance.
- 2.6 RM: Shall mean the R.M of Frenchman Butte No. 501.

3.0 SCOPE:

- 3.1 Fees and regulations by which private drives and lanes will be snowploughed occasionally.
- 3.2 Fees and regulations by which private drives and lanes will be snowploughed on a regular basis.

4.0 POLICY:

- 4.1 Before any snowploughing will take place, the landowner shall sign an annual *Custom Work Waiver Form.*
- 4.2 The landowner may telephone or email the RM office to request the driveway or lane be cleared of snow.

Snowploughing of Private Drives and Lanes Policy

- 4.3 A fee of \$75.00 will be charged each time the driveway or lane is cleared.
- 4.4 Snowploughing will be completed when RM equipment is clearing snow from an adjacent RM roadway, or when it works best for the grader operator's schedule.
- 4.5 Landowners may request that their driveway or lane be cleared <u>every</u> time the RM equipment is snowploughing the adjacent RM road. A *Custom Work Waiver Form* must be completed annually and they will be invoiced \$75.00 each time their private driveway or lane is snowploughed unless notice is received that they wish to discontinue this service.
- 4.6 Snowploughing of custom requests, ie: seasonal roads, grain bins, or corrals may be completed when time permits or when it works best for the grader operator's schedule. Custom requests will be charged to whomever calls in the work.
- 4.7 This policy shall be reviewed from time to time and shall continue until such time as this policy is repealed by resolution of Council.

5.0 EXCEPTIONS – (if applicable)

- 5.1 Where it is more practical for grader to turn around within a yard rather than at the end of a dead-end road there will be no charge for snowploughing of driveway and lanes.
- 5.2 In the case where landowner does not reside within the RM, however the road fronting the property is maintained by the RM, snowploughing of driveway and lane requests will be invoiced to the municipality in which they reside.

6.0 REPEALING:

All Appendices attached to this policy may be amended from time to time based on operational need.

This policy shall be administered and interpreted by the CAO; however, this policy cannot be amended without Council approval.
