

BYLAW No. 8.

A BYLAW FOR REMOVAL OF BRUSH ADJOINING ROADS.

THE COUNCIL of The Rural Municipality of Frenchman Butte No. 501 enacts as follows:

- 1. The council is hereby authorized to provide for the removal at the expense of the municipality of brush, except where the same is used as a shelter belt, growing on private property within one hundred feet from the centre of any road other than a provincial highway, whether growing before or after the passing of this bylaw.
- 2. The person or persons authorized by the council to perform the work as herein provided shall have the right of entry on private property for such purpose only.
- 3. Any person who refuses the right of entry, or who in any way hinders entry upon land for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this bylaw shall be deemed to be guilty of an offense, and liable to the penalties provided in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.

READ THREE TIMES by unanimous vote, and passed by the Council of The RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF FRENCHMAN BUTTE NO. 501, at Paradise Hill, in the Province of Saskatchewan, this 4th day of February A.D. 1954.
